





### **Getting from Merida International Airport to the event venues**



By car

Some car rental companies are located on the ground floor of the airport terminal.

It takes about 20 minutes to drive on Highway 261 from the airport to the event venues.



By bu

The ADO bus company operates a route from the airport to downtown Merida, with departures every hour.

Tickets can be purchased at the counter located on the upper floor of the airport terminal.



The trip can be requested at the counters located on the ground floor of the airport terminal.

The trip to the Hyatt Regency Hotel takes about 30 minutes.

The rates to the hotel area (zona hotelera) and downtown Merida start at \$15 USD.

## **GENERAL INFORMATION**



#### **Dress Code**

Clothing made of breathable fabrics such as cotton or linen is recommended. For men, wearing a long shirt known as "guayabera" or Cuban jacket, white or light colored, is suggested.



#### Weather

The weather is hot and humid, with an average temperature of 26.61° C (79.25°F). The hottest season is from April to August, with temperatures up to 40°C (104°F). The rainy season goes from May to October. The average temperature in September is Max. 34°C (93.2°F) / Min. 23° (73.4°F).



#### **Time Zone**

Central Standard Time (CST), which is 6 hours behind the Universal Coordinated Time (UTC-6), all year long.



#### **Currency**

The legal currency in Mexico is the Mexican peso. Most ATMs accept VISA and MasterCard cards, among others, to withdraw Mexican pesos. Usually, retail stores also accept VISA and MasterCard debit and credit cards.

#### **Tips**

In Mexico, it is usual and voluntary to include a tip between 10% and 15% of the total amount of consumption in restaurants, as a gratuity for the received service.

#### Language


The official language is Spanish, but some rural communities still speak the Mayan language.

# MERIDA THE WHITE CITY

Merida is the economic and cultural capital of southeast Mexico. It is a cosmopolitan destination, designated in 2019 as a UNESCO Creative City of Gastronomy.

It is less than 50 km from the Gulf of Mexico, on the northeastern part of the state of Yucatan. It borders with Quintana Roo to the east, with Campeche to the west, and with the Gulf of Mexico to the north.

It is notable for its sober, colonial architecture, where buildings with high ceilings and large windows stand out; but above all, it is known for the color of the quarry stone, a typical material of the region used to erect many of its buildings, giving it an appearance leading to the nickname of Ciudad Blanca (the White City).
